#### St Anne's Churchyard Maintenance (Rev Pat Gillian)

During the past few weeks, we have come together as a village and church community to help each other maintain the churchyard at St Anne's. With the different types of weather we have had over the past few months, the undergrowth and hedges have put on a growth spurt. We started on the lower churchyard and around the Garden of Remembrance, clearing the undergrowth from the banking, where we plan to plant bushes, spring bulbs and wildflowers to make a wonderful colourful display in the spring.

We have now moved onto the Southside area at the side of church, cutting the undergrowth back to the drystone wall - revealing some of the older graves which had become overgrown. We have an arborist Nik who is giving us advice about the trees in the churchyard and help with tree maintenance.

To help the wildlife/birds to thrive in the churchyard, we are accepting donations of spring bulbs, bee hotels, bird feeders and bird boxes. We have also had some anonymous cash donations for which we are very grateful and will be put towards improvements, thank you.

We have planned a churchyard working party on one Saturday of each month (keep an eye on the church notice boards for which Saturday) from 9.30am for an hour or so and would welcome assistance from our church congregation and our friends in the village. I know Saturdays are not always convenient for people and that some of our friends from the village are cutting back and clearing undergrowth during the week for which we are very grateful.

If you would like to help us but unsure what you can do, please get in touch and we can meet and discuss what needs to be done. ### STATION BREW

In the heart of Saddleworth, opposite Greenfield Railway Station, sits our little cafe, Station Brew. Opened in July 2017 after months of dreaming, planning and building, Station Brew is now an established favourite spot for local people and visitors alike.

We created the interior of our cafe using stone flags, wooden beams and lintels removed from the building during the transformation work. We furnished it with upcycled tables, chairs and crates, including an old teacher's desk still with an ink well, school chairs with children's names etched into them, and an old ladder from a ladder company in Greenfield dated at the turn of the century.

There are maps, games and lots of books for you to browse whilst having your coffee and cake and a range of local crafts, jewellery, books and produce to browse and purchase during your visit.

Our aim has always been to provide fresh quality food and drinks using local businesses like our own. McLintock's Dairy provides us with fresh local milk and free-range eggs daily. A. Taylor butchers in Mossley provides us with all our meat, Alimentari di Alberti our fruit and vegetables, Carr's Bakery in Ashton our muffins and Tea Punks our range of fruit and herbal teas. Alongside Roger's award-winning bread and Darkwood's award winning coffee these suppliers all help us to serve the highest quality local produce to our customers.

We serve a wide range of breakfast and brunch options including our signature Grilled Green Cheese with poached eggs—made using avocados and spinach. There are vegetarian and vegan options available too, a keto breakfast and dairy and gluten free choices. Lunches include a range of hot and cold sandwiches, soups and salads, including the very popular Halloumi Harrissa toastie.

All our cakes are made in house and currently include Chocolate Brownies, Californian Orange Cake, Fancy Flapjacks, Vegan Pecan Brownies, Vegan Lemon Drizzle and Bakewell Tart. Or, if you have enough room, our Station Brew Sundae made with the delicious Northern Bloc Ice cream, is a hit during the summer months.

We have a varied children's menu and all our meals are available for takeaway. Our takeaway cups and containers are compostable or recyclable. Highchairs and baby changing facilities are available and we welcome well behaved dogs.

We open Tuesday to Friday 9 till 3.30, Saturday 9 till 4 and Sunday 10 till 4. Tables can be booked in advance by calling 01457 237384, messaging us on Facebook or pop in as you are passing. We ensure our cafe is Covid safe for our staff and customers and have measures in place to ensure you have an enjoyable and safe visit.

After months of uncertainty it is wonderful to have customers seated in our cafe again enjoying being together and we look forward to welcoming more of you in the near future.

### Diary of a Lydgate Farmer

Here we are mid-August. The cattle are all outside enjoying the good weather when it's good and putting up with it when it isn't!

We have another cut of silage to do and then we start to make plans for the winter, making sure buildings are secure and weatherproof and that we will have enough supplies for about one hundred mouths to last until next May - a long time. It will depend on the weather how long the cattle stay outside. Our job is very weather dependent and a constant topic of conversation with farmers.

The newspapers have been full of the story of Geronimo the alpaca who has twice tested positive for bovine TB and will have to be put down. There has been a huge outcry fuelled by the media. This ignores all the thousands of cattle which are put down every year after testing positive. This must break many owners hearts, young pedigree animals perhaps due to give birth so the calf goes as well, young very well bred bulls just ready to start breeding - our country's way of dealing with this disease is to cull all these animals which have tested positive.

It's very hard for all concerned and when your farm has a TB test you wait with baited breath to know you are clear, or the heartbreak begins.
